## SOMMELIER'S PAGE

### ZINFANDEL: CALIFORNIA'S HERITAGE GRAPE

Don't blame California's Zinfandel producers if they seem to have a bit of an inferiority complex; all too often their best efforts fail to garner attention by the world's wine cognoscenti. Discussions of the best California wines more likely revolve around which Cabernet Sauvignon leads the pack, which Chardonnay is the most opulent yet refined, or which Pinot Noir is currently knocking people's socks off. A proposed 2006 State Senate bill recognizing Zinfandel as California's historic grape was even vetoed by Governor Schwarzenegger, as that would have been unfair to Chardonnay and Cabernet producers.

But the facts are the facts: Zinfandel, whose origin is actually Croatian and is recognized as the genetic twin of the Italian Primitivo, resides near the deepest roots of the California viticultural family tree. There are wineries producing great Zinfandel today who can trace their origins to the nineteenth century, and Zinfandel vines planted during the gold rush still endure today in the Sierra Foothills. Long before Cabernet was king, "California" and "Zinfandel" went hand in hand.

Perhaps Zin's image problem is that the wine it produces isn't "serious" enough. The exuberance of its fruit flavors and easy drinking style just don't merit meditation. But that isn't to say that the wine isn't delicious. Zinfandel produces juicy, spicy, lip-smacking wines that are often the perfect match for grilled meat with rich sauces. In short, a great wine to enjoy with dinner at the EPIC Roasthouse. Below is a list of some of our favorites.

#### **Seghesio, Alexander Valley, *Home Ranch* 2008**

77

Edoardo Seghesio planted his first Zinfandel vines in Sonoma's Alexander Valley in 1895, and to this day the winery is a family affair. The approach to winemaking can be likened to an apprentice before a teacher; if the vineyard can teach the winemaker something, then the winemaker listens. These Zinfandels are some of the most balanced and nuanced one can experience.

#### **Turley, Paso Robles, *Dusi Vineyard* 2007**

90

No discussion here would be complete without a wine from Turley. Big, bold; even shameless would be appropriate descriptors. In the immortal words of *Spinal Tap* Guitarist Nigel Tufnel, "*This one goes to eleven.*" Larry Turley has access to some of the oldest and best sites for this vine, and never disappoints.

#### **Ridge, Dry Creek Valley, *Del Carlo* 2003**

18/72

We present this wine for those who argue that Zinfandel has no potential for long-term development. This wine comes from Ray Teldeschi's Sonoma vineyard, where pre-prohibition vines still give fruit and the average vine age is around 60 years. This is the epitome of traditional Zinfandel. 100% air-dried American oak lends a rustic feel to the wine and at this stage is perfectly integrated into brambly fruit and subtle earth tones. Ridge is one of the California classics and justifiably so.

#### **Rosenblum, Rockpile, *Rockpile Road Vineyard* 2007**

16/68

Kent and Kathy Rosenblum made the jump from home winemaking to commercial production in 1978, and never looked back. Their portfolio now boasts 41 different bottlings of Zinfandel, Petite Sirah, and traditional Rhône varieties, each carefully crafted by winemaker John Kane. This wine from Sonoma's Rockpile AVA exhibits soft richness on the palate with forward oak and briary fruit.

#### **Robert Biale, Napa Valley, *Black Chicken* 2006**

98

The Biale family began growing grapes in Napa during the prohibition, and the name Black Chicken references a time when wine was sold on the sly to friends and neighbors. As legend has it, Aldo Biale would include jug Zinfandel in a produce delivery if a "black chicken" was part of the order. The wine is big and bold but retains balance, with peppery spice and woody earth.

#### **Brown Estate, Napa Valley 2008**

72

A relative newcomer to the scene, Brown planted their first vines in 1985 and bottled their first wine in 1996. The style is "old-school"; aging in French and American oak lends a balanced wood impression with complex spices on the nose and juicy dark fruit on the palate.
